## Field of Study Learning Outcomes

- 4. Demonstrate proficiency in research methods and citation practices relevant to study in the humanities.

## Field of Study Course Guidelines

The Field of Study area consists of 18 hours of lower-division (1000- and 2000-level) courses related to English studies and other courses which may be prerequisite to higher level major courses, distributed as follows:

1.	Courses relevant to English studies as specified by each institution.	6- 18 credit hours
	These may include courses in literary study, advanced composition and rhetoric, professional writing, creative writing, the humanities, history and/or the social sciences.	
2.	At least one world literature or world literature-based humanities course, if not taken in another area.	0 – 3 credit hours
3.	May include up to nine (9) hours of world language courses, more than one world language, or American Sign Language.	0 – 9 credit hours
	Total:	42 credit hours
